On 11 September 2001, 44 people boarded Flight 93 from Newark to San Francisco: 33 were regular passengers, seven were crew, four were hijackers. As two planes crashed into the World Trade Center and another into the Pentagon, the citizens on board United Airways Flight 93 had to decide whether to sit tight or try to take back the plane. The film is emotionally raw yet unsentimental; it is both brilliant and troubling.

Set in the week following the death of Princess Diana, *The Queen* depicts the backstage conversations between Prime Minister Blair and HM Elizabeth II. Michael Sheen's rendering of Blair is unsettling and hilarious - bobbing around like a madly grinning Jack-in-the-Box before ever-present cameras. Mirren is dignified in her portrayal of inner turmoil – and may be worth an Oscar.
